It has come to my attention as well as the attention of my friends and many local businesses that Mutual Distributing Co. in Greensboro, NC has come out to publicly oppose NC HB 392, an effort to eliminate the 6% alcohol-by-volume cap on beer in the state of North Carolina. I have volunteered a great deal of my time and efforts to help educate my state legislators about the archaic nature of the 6% cap on beer.
