Willard Holt Jr.: Pioneer in the medical profession

Willard Sloan Holt Jr., a doctor who pioneered for African Americans in the medical profession, died of an aneurysm Friday at Providence Hospital in Southfield.

He was 72 and lived in South-

field. His specialty was anesthesiology.

Dr. Holt did his internship at Joseph's St. Hospital South Bend, Ind., and his anesthesia residency at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit. He was the first black

person in both programs.

He also practiced at Mt. Carmel Mercy Hospital in Detroit, where he became chairman of the anesthesia department, managing 20 anesthesiologists, then president of the medical staff. He was the first black person to hold both of those jobs.

In 1949, Dr. Holt earned his bachelor's degree at Hampton (Va.) University and went to Winton, N.C., to teach math and science in high school. There he met teacher Vivian Scott, whom he

married in 1953. He also became a member of Omega Psi Phi frater-

But the Korean War intervened, and he joined the Army, where he served as a sergeant at Ft. Jackson, S.C. During an intramural football game, he broke his collarbone, and when his unit was shipped overseas, he was left behind. Not one member of his unit who went overseas survived the

After the Army, Dr. Holt earned a master's degree in physiology at the University of Illinois and his medical degree at Meharry Medical College, in Nashville, Tenn., in 1960.

In Michigan, he also worked at St. Joseph Mercy/Oakland hospital in Pontiac. He belonged to Hartford Memorial Baptist Church in Detroit.

Besides his wife, survivors include a son, Willard Holt III; a daughter, Kimberly Holt-May, and four grandchildren.

A memorial service will be at 11 a.m. Thursday at Hartford, 18700 James Couzens Highway, where the family will receive friends for an hour before the service. Arrangements are by the Swanson Funeral Home in Detroit.
